## HEARING OF DELEGATIONS: None.

Public Hearing for status of funding for the water project. The public hearing was open for comments. Diana Johnson from UERPC read the 4 points. CITIZEN PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS. To comply with the participation requirements of Section 508 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1987, local government applicants and recipients must do the following: 1) Conduct at least one public hearing on the status of funded activities. The hearing on the status of funded activities must include a review of:(a) general description of accomplishments to date: the total project is approximately 98% complete. Accomplishments to date include water main installation, service reinstatement and surface restoration. (b) a summary of expenditures to date: The latest pay estimate is current through August 19, 2024, and indicates that Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) reimbursable expenditures to date are at \$924,793.29 in terms of total project completed. This includes the

expenditures of contractor work and related expenses of \$911,819.29 and administrative expenditures of \$12,974. The total CDBG expenditure requested-to-date is 68%. Of the total spent, grant funds received include \$340,135 and local match expenditures include \$584,658.29. There is still \$159,865 in grant funds available to draw down, which includes \$147,839 in construction needs and administration of \$12,026. (c) a general description of remaining work: The remaining work consists of the following: submittal of final vibration monitoring report for approval. (d) a general description of changes made to the project budget, performance targets, activity schedules, project scope, location, objectives or beneficiaries: Since the CDBG end date is set for September 30, 2025, the project is currently 98% completed, and there is no extension of the timeline of these funds, the city anticipates finalizing this project as intended. The city does not anticipate any changes in project scope, location, objections, or beneficiaries and expects all funds to be depleted by or before the CDBG deadline of September 30, 2025.
